Measuring the Impact of the Sports Premium Funding

- Increased Participation in sporting activities all year groups offered after school sports clubs at different times of the year
- School has participated in local sporting events both competitive and non-competitive
- The school continues to achieve good level of success in competition in all sports with several trophies and shields being won this year including year two football tournament for first time
- Many children joined local sporting/activity clubs:- Atherstone Rangers, Wendy Morton Dance Academy, Baddesley Badgers Running Club, Atherstone Hockey Club and Rugby Club, Atherstone Cricket, Boxing and Karate Club, North Warwickshire Swimming Club, Cottage Farm Rangers Club, Phantom Knights Marching Band - with links to clubs made through school
- Thirty children gained Bikeability Certificates at level 1 and 2
- The development of the MUGA has meant outdoor football can take place all year round
- Increased level of skill in teaching PE through staff training
- Teaching Assistant trained in PE teaching, pupils have access to high quality PE lessons by qualified staff and pupil's skill levels are improving planning and assessment in PE has improved and a greater number of staff are involved
- Children are enjoying PE and are more ready to participate –skills acquired in lessons are being used in playground games (school monitoring has recorded this)
- EYFS outdoor area greatly enhanced enabling children to develop a wider range of gross motor skills, climbing, balancing etc
- All classes are timetabled to do 'outdoor and adventurous activity' through Forest Schools utilising the school grounds and new Eco
 classroom -children are develop valuable skills in outdoor environment
- Older children take part in residential to Wales
